<b>START Update</b>	NY START Program is a community-based OPWDD program that offers crisis prevention and response services to individuals with intellectual/developmental disabilities and complex behavioral health needs as well as to their families and those who provide support. They emphasize the development of cross systems relationships, trainings and education, as well as crisis prevention and response supports. Its goals include helping individuals remain in their homes and communities, and enhancing their opportunities for leading healthy, successful and richer lives. Referrals are accepted from individuals, families, service providers (I/DD & mental health), hospitals, psychiatric	N/A

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<b>START Update continued</b>	centers and other crisis services for individuals age 6 and over who have an intellectual/developmental disability and complex behavioral health needs with an OPWDD eligibility determination. They are fully operational in Western New York, Finger Lakes, Capital District, Taconic and Hudson Valley regions. Teams in Long Island and Central New York will become available as the statewide implementation continues.
